

When You Vote, Bring ID

Many forms of identification will be accepted. They are:

Early and Absentee Voting

- The last four digits of voter's Social Security number; or driver's license number; **or**
- A copy of a current and valid photo identification, (i.e. Ohio driver's license, state ID, government ID). Photo identification must show name and address; **or**
- A copy of a current utility bill (including cell phone bill), bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the voter's name and current address (including from a public college or university).

Election Day Voting

- A current and valid photo identification (i.e. Ohio driver's license, state ID, government ID). Photo identification must show name and address (does not need to be current address for driver's license); **or**
- A military identification; **or**
- A copy of a current utility bill (including cell phone bill), bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the voter's name and current address (including from a public college or university).

Note: Ohio law provides you cannot use as proof of identification a notice that the board of elections mailed to you. Voters who do not provide one of these documents will still be able to vote by provisional ballot.

(PLEASE NOTE THAT PASSPORTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF ID)

Voters who do not provide one of these documents will still be able to vote by providing the last four digits of the voter's social security number and by casting a provisional ballot. Voters who do not own any of the above forms of identification, including a social security number, will still be able to vote by signing an affirmation swearing to the voter's identity under penalty of election falsification and by casting a provisional ballot. If identification is not provided at the time the provisional ballot is cast, the provisional voter may provide a valid form of identification in person at the Board of Elections during the 10 days following Election Day.
